



## Board Highlights at a Glance

December 8 & 9, 2022 Meeting of CDO Board of Directors



### Policies

**Approved in principle:** Virtual care standards and practice guidelines.

**Approved:** Social media standards and practice guidelines for dietitians in Ontario.

**Approved:** The 2020-24 Strategic Plan will be extended for one year to March 2025.



### Governance Modernization

**Approved:** CDO Board Competency and Attribute Framework to be incorporated into College governance processes and in Board elections.

**Approved in principle:** The size of the board to be reduced to six professional directors over a two-year period (2024 – 2025) to strike a more equal balance between public appointed and professional directors.

**Approved:** With the introduction of the competency framework, Board directors will no longer be required to be nominated by their peers in order to stand for election, starting in 2024.

#### Public Awareness

CDO Public Awareness Campaign relaunched October 1st, with digital advertising driving record website traffic, and public protection videos appearing on the Canadian Health Media Network.

#### Registration

Enhanced communication efforts and inquiry responses led to a significant reduction in late notices during renewal season.

#### Equity, Diversity, Inclusion and Belonging
